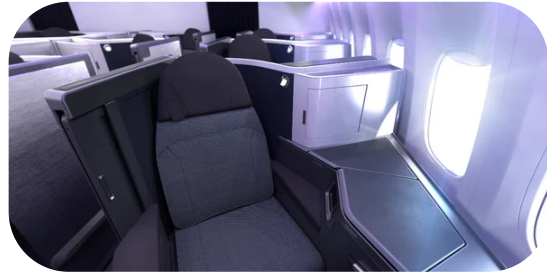
A new experience for our 777 fleet Business Premier

Today, we unveil a **first look at our new cabin designs for our Boeing 777 aircraft** - set to receive a refreshed onboard experience from 2027.

The first refurbished Boeing 777-300ER is scheduled to enter service in May 2027, introducing new Business Premier™ and Economy cabins that will deliver a more modern and consistent customer experience across our international fleet.



The refreshed Business Premier cabin will feature the new Collins Elevation seat in a forward-facing layout, providing customers with greater comfort, privacy, and personal space. Every seat will include a privacy door, while centre seats will feature sliding privacy dividers. Customers will also enjoy upgraded 18-inch inflight entertainment screens with Bluetooth audio connectivity.



Key features include:

- 44 seats (unchanged from current layout)
- 43" pitch seats that convert to a lie-flat bed
- All seats will have doors for enhanced privacy
- Centre seats have sliding privacy dividers
- 18" inflight entertainment screens with Bluetooth audio connectivity

Economy

The Economy cabin will introduce new ergonomically designed seats, including Economy Stretch for customers seeking additional legroom. All Economy customers will benefit from upgraded 13-inch inflight entertainment screens with Bluetooth audio connectivity.

Key features include:

- 246 seats (two additional seats compared to the current layout)
- Economy Stretch seats with 35" pitch
- Standard Economy seats with 31"-32" pitch
- 13" inflight entertainment screens with Bluetooth audio connectivity

Our **Premium Economy cabin** will remain unchanged, following a recent refresh programme that introduced new seat covers and cabin curtains.

These upgrades will provide customers with a more consistent onboard experience across our international widebody fleet.

The Boeing 777-300ER retrofit programme will begin in 2027, with the first 777 scheduled to be retrofitted in March 2027, and in service by May.

Further information, including availability for sale and GDS updates, will be shared closer to the first aircraft entering service.
